BB@HOME GB@HOME RECYCLED BIRD FEEDER



You will need

2 Plastic drinks bottles. (one needs to be smaller than the other)

Paint & decorating materials. (be creative)

Glue, scissors, string.

Bird feed/seed or alternative. (see RSPB website)

Instructions

Step 1: Cut off the top section from the larger bottle and the bottom section of the smaller bottle. (bottom approx. 12cm) (adult supervision required)

Step 2: Cut a circular hole or an entrance slot in the bottom section of the smaller bottle for the bird to enter. (adult supervision required)

Step 3: Decorate both sections in your own personal style. Be creative and use whatever you can find. (left over paint in the garage or shed) Buttons, glue pens, stickers. Anything goes!

Step 4: Carefully pierce a hole in the bottle lid, create a loop with a length of string or wool. Secure and screw back on bottle top. Alternatively, just tie string around the neck of the bottle. (adult supervision required)

Step 5: Run glue around the top lip of the bottom section and push up into the top section. Hold in place and leave to dry. (adult supervision required)

Step 6: Finish any decorating and then fill with your choice of bird food. Hang in a suitable place and wait for your first customers. They don't need to be hung up, they could just be placed in a suitable location.

Make sure you watch out for the different types of birds you might see. Try to take some pictures to share.

Check out the RSPB website to learn about the common birds you may find on your feeder.
